

# Continuous Improvement: We are not perfect but we are hard working and professional

We teach and live a faith principle that each one of us is unique and special and that school works to bring out the gifts and talents of everyone. As a staff team we are constantly striving to recognise what is going well in our school and what can be done to further improve what we offer. We work hard and we try to work smart. We work to see the whole school, our classes and each pupil. Despite our high expectations of course we are not perfect. We are always open to hearing thoughts that you may have as you would clearly see the school from a different place to us. If you see or hear something that you think could be improved email or speak to us. We can't improve things we don't know about.

#### Lunchtime changes

This term we now have all of reception class, year 1 and year 2 coming straight into the dining hall at 12.00. The children are seated and then called up to the servers table by table. This means that all four lunch time staff can be on and to encourage and support the service. It has been going well.

Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 then join the service from 12.30pm. Year 3 at 12.30pm, Year 4 at 12.40pm, Year 5 12.50pm and Year 6 at 1.00pm. Year 3 are working to adjust from their KS1 lunchtime as they are now eating half an hour later than previously.

We have also been asking parents to select food from the menu by accessing Parent Pay. If you and your child know what they have selected and they know it is food they have chosen this can help their eating and lunch enjoyment. It also helps the efficiency of the service so that caterers can have more information about the food levels for the service. We did hear earlier in the year that parents were concerned that food had run out in this service. This has not happened this year so please do check in with the school office if you have any worries.

We would encourage all parents to encourage their children to access the fruit, snacks and milk that we offer children as part of the Blackpool offer. This tops up their food levels through the day.

**Water is best:** A reminder that children should only have water during the school day. Those children who have packed lunch should have lunch that has an appropriate level of sugar and this would include any flavoured drinks. We do not think it is ever appropriate for energy based drinks and would remove these from children and return them at the end of the day.

**Relationship Learning:** We give lots of time to encourage children to make the right choice and in being able to resolve everyday relationship issues calmly and positively. It is part of children's learning that they will come up against emotions and every day challenges during the school working day. It is a key part of our work to develop in each child the skills to make the right choice and to manage emotions around solving problems.

In school we teach that if someone makes the wrong choice that does not give someone the right to make one back again. It is part of our whole school culture to nurture in each child the assertive skills to recognise that something is making them feel unsafe or unhappy and that they have the right to say STOP. We actively teach them to have safe people in school and at home who they can talk to if they can't resolve something on their own. If children feel justified in making a wrong choice back again then we are potentially contributing to a culture that says anything goes; we would never say this to the children but we do recognise that for young people it is where the current knife culture has come from.

We would always work to resolve issues calmly and purposefully and would ask parents to support this approach too. If you ever have questions or concerns then always ask a staff member. Forgiveness is a skill we actively encourage and teach.

As a school we also teach relationship building through our school values, weekly assemblies and curriculum approaches. Every child a leader and real opportunities to work with and for each other are important ways that children can reflect on who they are and who they want to be. It is utterly central to our work as a faith school.

## **NSPCC Workshops**

This year we will be introducing NSPCC workshops into school. On Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October Year 1 and 2 then Year 3,4, 5 and 6 will access an assembly lead by Mrs Mannix which is part of the reminder about children's rights to say STOP and TELL and an introduction to the work of the NSPCC. The following week on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> October NSPCC volunteers will run additional workshops for Year 2, 5 and 6. These workshops use age appropriate language and ideas to ensure that children know what it means to be safe and how to manage that. Over the next few weeks, as a result of this input, children may ask you questions.

A reminder that we are asking children to complete tasks at home in return for tinned food and dried goods for our collection for Blackpool Foodbank. Thank you in advance for your support with this.



#### Year 6 Show Racism the Red Card



On Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> October will work with this education charity at Blackpool Football Club. They work with football players and the charity educators to develop their understanding of what racism is and why we all work to stop it. Last year was a powerful day of change so we look forward to finding out what the class group have learned from this event.

**Uniform Reminders**: We ask that families respect our uniform choices and this includes shoes, hair styles and jewellery wearing. We ask that children wear black shoes appropriate for school. That hair is natural in colour and long hair is tied back with single, simple hair bands. We would also remind parents that we do not encourage scarring cut into hair styles.

Any jewellery should be limited to simple studs and removed for PE.

We are noticing that PE foot wear amongst older children is becoming something of a competition with bright and expensive brand footwear being introduced. This is not necessary and in light of the challenges families are facing we would ask you to consider sending your child in with non-branded black trainers going forwards. We would most certainly request that any children wearing branded goods would not act unkindly towards others. This is not in line with our values.
